Research Overview – Ashley Blake

Who am I?

I am a PhD Researcher at the University of Birmingham investigating individual differences in children's language development. I am part of a large team led by Professor Ewa Dąbrowska. As a group we research different aspects of first and second language acquisition and attainment.

What is my research about?

We believe that language is a complex, cognitive skill and my research explores the relationship between cognitive skill learning and language development. In particular, I am interested in finding out how the speed of automatization predicts differences in children's language ability, both in children with and without language difficulties, such as DLD.


Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, all sessions are now conducted online via Zoom. Children take part in a variety of tasks over three research sessions, which include the Tower of Hanoi puzzle and various language and cognitive tasks. Children usually enjoy the different activities, especially the puzzle!

Expected results

I look forward to sharing the outcome of my study with the E-DLD group as soon as my research study is complete. I am still inviting children with developmental language disorder (aged 7-9 years) to participate, so if you are interested, please do not hesitate to contact me.

I have really enjoyed meeting children all over the country and am very grateful for all the families that have generously given their time to take part in my research study. We hope that our research findings will help us to develop supportive therapies for children with DLD.
